God Comes to Us Disguised As our Life

This week, we return to the occasional essays in which members of the community at Old St. Joseph's reflect on Ignatius' direction to 'find God in all things.'

When I was asked to write an essay for the parish bulletin, the suggested topic was "creating a life after retirement." In addition, it was proposed that I identify the keystone of Ignatian spirituality, i.e., "finding God in all things," or at least those significant events that occurred during this phase of life.

After I reflected on this topic, it became clear that I had to edit the topic, changing it from "creating a life after retirement" to "the life that was created for me after retirement." The reason for the change was the essence of Ignatian spirituality, "finding God in all things." In the interest of full disclosure, I can identify the presence of God much easier in hindsight than in real time. While thinking about this essay, I was also listening to a book by Richard Rohr, the noted Franciscan writer, who quoted his friend, the spiritual writer Paula D'Arcy. She said, "God comes to us disguised as our life." My immediate reaction was "Wow." This essay suddenly took shape and I knew how to tell my story of life after retirement.

The most significant change in my life happened before I even thought seriously about retirement. In May 1993, my wife Anne passed away after a long, courageous battle with multiple sclerosis. That same month, our son and youngest child graduated from



college. Our daughter had graduated four years earlier and was starting a career as a writer in the entertainment industry in Hollywood. All of a sudden, my major identifiers changed. I was no longer a husband, a caregiver or a father to a child under age 21 living at home.

At the time, I decided that the only decision I would make was that I would make no major life-changing decisions in the immediate future. I was 56, still an executive with an advertising agency in Philadelphia and not ready for retirement. But over the course of the next two years, I felt a stirring in me. I didn't know it at the time, but God was coming to me disguised as my life.

I thought about joining something like the Jesuit Volunteer Corps (JVC), but after a fairly long search, I found that, at that time, such opportunities were all geared to younger college graduates. Then two events took place in the regular course of my life

that shaped my life both before and after retirement.

Over lunch with a friend who was well connected to Jesuit institutions, I mentioned my fruitless search for a volunteer opportunity. He told me about a new ministry called the Ignatian Volunteer Corps (IVC). I got in touch with IVC and discussed my status as a non-retired and fully-employed candidate. Since I had no family responsibilities, I believed that I could fulfill the required 16 hours of service a week while still working. I was soon assigned to Holy Name of Camden to organize and manage a fundraising program. I could utilize many of the skills that I had developed during my years with ad agencies: including communication and working with others who are not always like-minded, such as the occasional Jesuit. So, in April 1995, I began a volunteer assignment in North Camden that continues until today. Stories about my life at Holy Name could happily fill a book. Suffice it to say that it has been a richly rewarding experience, where I learned most of all that what is important is “presence” not “presents.” The Latino community at Holy Name let me know that they were happy because I was there, not because of what I could do for them.

About the same time that I found IVC, another mundane, life-shaping event took place. I was having dinner with clients on a Saturday night and thought that I would go to Mass in the city before dinner. I asked friends about Catholic churches in Society Hill, and someone mentioned Old St. Joseph’s. I had never been there. Walking into Old St. Joseph’s for the first time, I was immediately struck by the church’s warmth and intimacy. I

thought I felt the presence of God. So I continued to attend OSJ and joined the parish rather quickly.

In 2000, I officially retired from the ad agency. I continued to volunteer at Holy Name and to attend Mass at OSJ. I became involved with Faith, Food and Friends (which was known then as Outreach). I also felt a stirring again and applied to the Peace Corps, even getting a tentative assignment teaching English in an Eastern European country. But in 2003, I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. Faced with the choice of going to Eastern Europe or staying in Philadelphia with world-class healthcare facilities, I chose the latter.

My involvement with Old St. Joseph’s continued to grow. I became chair of a newly-formed social justice committee and deepened my involvement with Outreach. In 2008, I undertook the 19th Annotation of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius with then-pastor Fr. Dan Ruff SJ. Life changing, to say the least. I became involved with hospital ministry, as a Eucharistic minister, an altar server and eventually, an usher. I was spending a great deal of time each week at OSJ and, when I was not there, I was across the river in North Camden. In the number of words a bulletin essay allots me, I have only been able to hint at the ways these ministries have been fulfilling.

In hindsight, I can clearly see the presence of God during the life that was created for me after retirement. I am eternally grateful for these great privileges. Pay attention to those stirrings. St. Ignatius calls us to listen to our feelings, our moods, our relationships. God may just be coming to us, disguised as our life.
