Sunday Mass now is being live-streamed at 9:30 AM on Sunday mornings. Access is available at **OldStJoseph.org** and **vimeo.com/osjphl**. This Mass is closed to the public so that music and a homily can be part of the liturgy. After the live-stream, a recording of the Mass is available for the following week at **vimeo.com/channels/osjsundaymass**.

### With Guidelines for Attendance, Mass Also Celebrated at 11:30 AM on Sundays

Mass also is being celebrated at Old St. Joseph's Church on Sundays at 11:30 AM. <u>Guidelines</u> for attendance must be followed. In keeping with the guidelines, people who should not attend Mass are those who are 65 years of age or older, are unwell, have any underlying health condition that increases their risk from COVID-19, are responsible for the care of anyone at increased risk from COVID-19 and/or work in a profession (such as health care) that makes it necessary to minimize their risk of exposure to COVID-19. It should be noted that Philadelphia Archbishop Nelson Pérez has dispensed all faithful from the obligation to attend Mass during this time of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has published <u>Practical Steps for Eradicating Racism</u> to "assist Catholics and people of good will in reflecting on the evil and harm of racism. While this is not a comprehensive list, it provides actionable steps that may assist Catholics to reflect and respond in faith. With the aid of Holy Scripture, Catholic social teaching, and sacred tradition, this is an open invitation to journey toward reconciliation."

**Kitchen Table Wisdom** by Rachel Naomi Remen Wednesday July 8, 3:30 PM


**Roman Fever** by Edith Wharton Friday July 10, 3:30 PM
