THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: January 1-7

History: On January 1, 1590 Pope Gregory XIV confirmed that "the title of the Society of Jesus by which this praiseworthy Order has been designated from its birth by the Apostolic See, and has hitherto been distinguished, shall be retained by it in all future ages." Gregory's predecessor, Sixtus V, who previously had been favorable to the Jesuits, in 1589 had decided to alter the name of the Institute, and to introduce other significant changes, but his death alone had prevented him to carrying out his plan.

Saints: January 3 The Most Holy Name of Jesus: This is the titular feast of the Society of Jesus. Unlike Dominicans or Benedictines, Ignatius and his followers call themselves "companions of Jesus, because it is the very person of Jesus, his "communicated identity" that united them and inflamed their hearts. The early Jesuits often repeated that "this Name is more beautiful than dawn and light" and "we Jesuits must be ready to give out blood for this name."

Do you speak Ignatian? Communal discernment is a process by which individuals attempt to articulate how the Holy Spirit is moving a group or community, to instill in its members greater awareness of the Lord's desires for them, greater appreciation of the Lord's vision for their future together, and greater freedom in responding generously to God's desires and dreams.

OSJ parishioners are invited to participate in the first steps of such a process during the January 22 forum on our commitments to social justice. Over the coming weeks, this column will lay out the steps in the process, and then touch on some of the central "stances" individuals assume to prepare for their engagement in process: individual personal praver. conversion, reconciliation and trust building, attentive listening. transparency, gratitude, and confirmation.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

Please join Fr. Frank Hannafey SJ, Fr. Paul Holland SJ and your Parish Pastoral Council on Sunday January 22 after the joint 10:30 AM Mass for a parish-wide prayer for discernment. The primary question for which we will seek guidance is: "How do we as a parish live the call to social justice?"

Immediately after Mass, we will gather in Barbelin Hall for refreshments, and then convene to pray together about the way forward in our social justice ministry. We expect to convene for about one hour.

The Society of Jesus has opted for a "universal apostolic preference" calling all Jesuits and all of their ministries to "walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world, those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice". As a Jesuit parish, how are we called to respond to this invitation? Council now invites everyone in our community to seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in finding our calling in this way of Christian discipleship.

Based upon the spirituality of St. Ignatius, the Jesuits utilize a process of "group discernment" that differs fundamentally from the usual business meeting. It is a form of group prayer, and it emphasizes careful listening to every participant. We pray that you will join us in deliberating together in this way, in the presence of the Holy Spirit!
