

Today's Gospel: John 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans. — Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water. "I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You

people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed, the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you."

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: March 12 - 18

History: March 12 1622 Ignatius and Francis Xavier, along with Teresa of Avila, Isidore the Farmer, and native of the City of Rome Philip Neri, are canonized. Roman wags declare that the Church has canonized four Spaniards and a Saint!

Saint: March 15 Servant of God Eusebio Kino SJ was an explorer and cartographer, founder of towns and cities, missionary, and builder of churches. So widespread were his accomplishments in southern Arizona that the state chose him as one of its two representatives for the statuary hall in the US Capitol in Washington. he is called "the apostle of the Sonora and southern Arizona. In his name the Kino Border Initiative was founded in January 2009 to work "with one foot on each side of the Mexico border in Nogales, Arizona and Nogales, Sonora, Mexico." It's humanitarian assistance, education and research/advocacy, KBI addresses the needs of deported migrants, the vulnerability of women and children to abuse and exploitation, and the reality of migration and its effects as a multinational phenomenon.

Ignatian Spirituality "What should I give up for Lent?" is the wrong question. Ignatius invites us to pray for the grace "to overcome oneself and order one's life". He starts with the grace and then moves toward action. What practices will help me open my heart to God to receive the grace that I am seeking?

Ask God, "What grace do you want to give me this Lent?" And then

"What practices (prayer? fasting and alms? tangible service? daily mass?) will help me open my heart to receive this grace?" Without self-reflecting, we can too quickly decide to just "do something for Lent" before we know which grace we are seeking. If you have a Lenten practice in mind, bring it to prayer. Three times, ask the question, "Why?" and answer with "because...." Jesus, I'm thinking of And here's why I'm doing that..." My Lenten practices now have a clearer sense of mission rooted in faith. This Lent, ask yourself: What grace am I seeking? What grace does God want to give me? After meditating on those questions, it will be clear "what I should do for Lent." (Joe Laramie, S.J.)





The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Rite of Christian Initiation

If you are pressed for time, read at least chapter 1 ("Social Justice and the Mission of the Church"), chapter 4 ("The Sources and Methods of Catholic Social Teaching"), chapter 5 ("Nine Key Themes of Catholic Social Teaching"), and the last two sections of chapter 6 (pp. 147–155). As you read, please note the questions at the end of each chapter. These will help you to reflect on your own response to our rich Catholic teaching on social justice and the questions will form the basis for the parish discussions.
