Today's Gospel: John 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

As Jesus passed by he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" — which means Sent —. So he went and washed, and came back able to see.

His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is, " but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am."

They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshiped him.

THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: March 19 - 25

History: March 21 1522 Ignatius arrives at Montserrat on feast of St. Benedict. After spending three days writing out a review of his sins and going to confession, he spends all night of the Vigil of the Feast of Annunciation in prayer before the icon of The Black Madonna, then lays his sword and dagger before her altar and takes up life as a pilgrim and penitent in Manresa.

Saint: March 19 St Joseph is the titular patron of all churches belonging to colleges of the Society of Jesus throughout much of Europe. Jesuit missionaries offered St. Joseph as the model of a loving spouse, devoted selflessly to protecting and caring for Jesus, who "came into our world in a state of great vulnerability" (Pope Francis). From our own Old St. Joseph's, founded in 1733 by Joseph Greaton SJ eventuated Saint Joseph's Prep and University. Moreover, St. Joseph was the baptismal patron of the first president of Saint Joseph's College, Felix Joseph Barbelin, S.J., who cultivated a personal devotion to St. Joseph and even composed poetry in his honor.

Ignatian Spirituality: Lenten alms giving. The Christian spiritual discipline of fasting is not simply an ascetical practice (and certainly not part of a weight-loss regime!), but a practical expression of solidarity with impoverished people for whom "fasting" is not optional. The money saved by fasting and abstinence from meal is meant to become a gift, whereby we "eat simply so that others may simply eat."

As Operation Rice Bowl notes, "Almsgiving flows from prayer and fasting. We reflect on the needs of the world and how God is calling us to meet those needs through prayer. We make room for the needs of others—and for the Holy Spirit to work within us—through fasting. Through a recognition of the world's needs and a personal commitment to act, we give alms." The Catechism calls almsgiving "a witness to fraternal charity" and "a work of justice pleasing to God."

In assessing how much we might give and to whom, St. Ignatius offers three possible touchstones: a) what most contributes to the glory of God? b) on my death bed, what will I wish I had done? c) as I stand with the Lord on the Day of Judgement, what will I wish I had done in fulfilling my duties for distributing alms?


