Dear Parishioners and Friends of Old St. Joseph's Church,

Another wonderful and hope-filled Easter has arrived! It may just be me-but it feels like last year's Easter celebration was only yesterday. (Is this a sign of one truly growing older, or, more the experience of joyful remembrance in the spirit of Marcel Proust?) I warmly remember our gatherings for Easter 2022. This year, we are especially grateful to have been able to come together in-person for our traditional marking of St. Joseph's Day with a special community Mass and dinner in Barbelin Hall. Thank you again to the many volunteers who made this event so wonderful for the parish. Easter is at the



heart and center of our faith, our memory and our present, so our celebration this year is welcome and full of promise.

Our faith this Easter and every Easter is that the Lord has truly risen, and our God continues to offer us the promise of new life. The first believers who were followers of Jesus were confused, afraid, and uncertain about the future after his suffering and death. Perhaps we can more identify with the experience of these first believers. It may be that in our vulnerability and weakness we recognize more clearly our need for Christ as a true Savior. We especially welcome the Risen Jesus Christ this year into our joy and also into our suffering. Let us try to rest with him for a while this Easter season.

Christ's Resurrection changes everything for us. May we actively search for him each day in the beauty and mystery of the world, in the goodness of people, in our parish community, and also in our real concerns of life now in our present. The Light of Christ has and will touch us and guide us in ways we may not expect to bring us life and hope.

On behalf of the OSJ Parish Staff, thank you for your inspiring presence and generous devotion to the community at Old St. Joseph's Church.

THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: April 9 - 15

History: April 10, 1836, Fr. Anthony Kohlmann SJ died in Rome. He won a landmark "seal of confession" legal case. In 1813, the City of New York had sought to compel Kohlmann to disclose the identity of a thief, which he had learned during confession. The state court eventually ruled that Kohlmann could not be compelled to violate the seal of confession, recognizing the confessional privilege for the first time in the US. Kohlmann went on to be president of Georgetown, then established Gonzaga College High School in Washington. He also laid the foundation for St. Patrick's Cathedral in NYC.

Saints: April 12: Bruno Bruni and Louis Cardeira, were the last of the eight Martyrs of Ethiopia. Bruno, inspired by Xavier, entered the Jesuits in 1608 in Italy.

Bruno, an Italian was born in Civitella del Tronto, Italy. He ministered to fellow novice John Berchmans during his final illness and wrote Berchmans' obituary. After ordination, Fr Bruni went to Ethiopia in 1625. Acting as architect and stonemason, he built three monasteries and brought about many conversions to the Church.

When the Jesuits were expelled from Ethiopia in 1634, Fr Bruni and six of his Jesuits brethrens remained behind and secretly continued their ministry. In April, Fr Bruni and two other Jesuits were attacked. The others died and Bruni was left for dead. Recovering, he resumed working with Fr Cardeira in a refuge on top of Mt Amba Salama. For five years they went about dispensing Sacraments and preaching God's Word until they were martyred in 1640.

Ignatian Spirituality: Jesuit mathematicians and scientists made a number of significant discoveries that helped expand our knowledge of mathematics, physics, and the world around us. Their discoveries helped pave the way for many of Newton's discoveries, as well as helped to consolidate the intellectual territories he and his contemporaries opened for inquiry. Jesuits were also among the first to differentiate between science and pseudo-science, questioning some of the more dubious claims and "discoveries" made in an era that did not always clearly differentiate between the natural and the supernatural.

NOMINATIONS NOW OPEN

The first elected Parish Pastoral Council members' terms were staggered to encourage continuity in membership over time. John Bitterman and Stephen Paesani were elected to one-year terms last year.

This Spring, Council will conduct elections for the two open seats on Council; each will have a three-year term. Council invites all registered parishioners to consider standing for election to those two seats. The two incumbents will stand for re-election to those two seats. A full description of the election process is on the Parish web site, oldstjoseph.org.

Nominations are now open as of April 1, 2023, and will close on April 16. Nominations may be emailed to the Parish Pastoral Council at osjpc@oldstjoseph.org. Also, paper nomination forms will be available in the back of the church. Include the nominee's full name, contact information and a brief reason for the nomination. Nominees will be reviewed for minimum qualifications and asked to submit a photo and a brief election statement for the Bulletin and website.

Voting will take place from May 6 to May 21 on the Parish website; paper ballots will also be available.

Minimum Qualifications for Elected Council Member

- Two years registered as a parish member
- Regular mass attendance
- Active participation in a parish ministry, committee, and/or community. Due to previous pandemic restrictions, past or present activity will be accepted. The parish Bulletin lists most parish ministries, communities, and committees that can serve as a reference.
- Referral comes from a fellow parishioner. Selfnominations are not permitted.

The Old St. Joseph's Parish Council is a group of elected and appointed members who serve as representation for our diverse parish family. Together with our pastor and resident priests, we discern and propose current parish initiatives. Our council welcomes any questions or suggestions from you, our parish community. The Parish Council meets monthly and can be reached anytime via email at osjpc@oldstjoseph.org. We look forward to hearing from you. Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

Mass of Christian Burial

The funeral director should call the parish office.

EASTER SUNDAY: Children will be invited to come to the front of the church during the 9:30 AM Mass to lead the


congregation in the singing of the Our Father. Visitors are kindly invited to celebrate these special events with the parish.
