Today's Gospel: John 14:1-12

Jesus said to his disciples: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be. Where I am going you know the way." Thomas said to him, "Master, we do not know where you are going; how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." Philip said to him, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us." Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father."

THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: May 7 - 13

History - May 8, 1861: President Abraham Lincoln visits Georgetown University, to review the 69th New York Regiment, known as the "Irish Regiment" which had been billeted there since early May. Bernard McMahon, a Jesuit Scholastic, and teacher in Georgetown's preparatory division, describes the impact of the Sixty-Ninth, as well as the only recorded visit by Abraham Lincoln to campus: . . . They are quite domesticated now and give extremely little trouble, save a general soiling of the establishment. They enjoy themselves hugely with the small boys' gymnasium and alley. A sentinel guards the large boys' gymnasium from everybody except the students. The see-saw for a time was the principal object of attraction. They'd get some green one, coax him on to it, and while in the air give it a twitch and dump him off . . . We have a regimental drill at three and company drill all day long. "Uncle Abe," accompanied by Mr. Seward, Cameron and others, drove up to the College on Wednesday and reviewed the troops . . .

Saint - May 8: Blessed John Sullivan, S.J. of Ireland. Sullivan was known as a deeply spiritual and endlessly generous man, and by some even he was known as a healer and a miracle-worker. His father was a wealthy barrister, and his mother came from a well-to do family. The boys were raised Protestant, the girls Catholic, like their parents. In his mid-30s, he became Catholic, and four years later entered the Jesuits. He became well known by people all around Clongowes as a virtuous and selfless man; he would travel often around to the nearby villages using an old bicycle and seeing to the need of the sick or the poor. Many people even attested to his healing power; with numerous seemingly miraculous cures during his time at Clongowes thought to have been due to him. A miracle has been attributed to him where a woman in Dublin in 1954 recovered from cancer after praying to John Sullivan. He was declared a 'Servant of God' in September 1960, 'Venerable' in November 2014 and 'Blessed' on 13 May 2017

Ignatian Spirituality: There's something thoroughly Ignatian about finding God in music. St. Ignatius's spiritual approach mostly bypasses the concepts and ideas stuffed into our heads and strives to touch the heart directly. That's what music does too. Music is literally beyond words. He himself loved to sing and to dance. As Chilean Jesuit Cristobal Fones puts it, "We as Jesuits have worked with the arts from the beginning, especially in the first two centuries. It's a way of communicating things, but not just a means—in a certain way it's also a sacramental. It has an inner value; it's not just something in between the message and the people. And I think the more we work with the arts, the more we enter the mystery of God and express it in a free way—gratuita— not trying to capture God, but just being with him. Being who we are... expressed in different ways—in this case, through music. I really believe God is like a chord. Like Ignatius did. At the Cardoner [a river in Manresa, Spain], he understood God as three musical keys, and that's a chord. There is something in harmony that reflects the beauty of God among us.



If you don't have Bluetooth, you'll need to use earphones with your smartphone.
