THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: May 14 - 20

History - May 20 1521: Inigo de Loyola (later St. Ignatius) was seriously wounded while defending the Castle of Pamplona against the French.

May 15 1815: The readmission of the Society into Spain. But the fathers were again exiled on July 31, 1820.

Saint: May 16 St Andrew Bobola Bobola was born in Poland, November 30, 1591. He became a Jesuit at age 20, ordained on March 12, 1622, the day Ignatius and Francis Xavier were canonized. Much of his pastoral work for the next twenty years involved preaching, restoring Catholicism in areas where many had stopped practicing, and caring for plague victims. He was heckled as "Robber of Souls" as some tried to shout him down, but he persisted and won back whole towns by spreading Eucharistic spirituality. In 1657 Russian Cossacks captured and brutally tortured him, demanding he convert to Orthodoxy. After his death, he was buried in the crypt beneath a Jesuit church and forgotten. In 1702, he appeared in a vision to the Jesuit rector in Pinsk, who ordered that the body should be found. When it was, the body was found incorrupt.

Ignatian Spirituality: The First Principle and Foundation: *The FPF* is a kind of touchstone that reveals in some way how far someone making the Spiritual Exercises is likely to go or to grow. The dry and laconic text is wholly free from emotional resonance, containing in its brevity and dryness all that later unfolds. It is less like the foundation of a building than a seed of life, a principle of force, of movement and growth. This principle of growth is not in the text or in the words but in the reality that the text expresses. The FPFP is like an X-ray that discloses one's desire that is already present, perhaps explicitly, perhaps latently, perhaps strongly and consciously, perhaps obscurely and delicately. Anyone who has some fairly mature experience of life and some realistic sense of self also begins to recognize the ambiguity of one's desires, the darkness in one's heart, one's moral impotence, the feelings that can surge in revolt or revulsion. One may realize, "I am not free. But I can desire to be. God wants me to be free."



COMMUNION UPDATE:

In light of the fact that the Covid-19 transmission rate is now at its lowest level ever and risks are extremely low, Eucharistic Ministers are no longer

obligated to wear a mask during the distribution of communion.



Laudato Si' Week 2023 will be celebrated May 21-28 to mark the eighth anniversary of Pope Francis' landmark encyclical on care for

creation. This global celebration will unite Catholics to rejoice in the progress we have made in bringing Laudato Si' to life.

This year's theme will be "Hope for the earth. Hope for humanity." The main resource guiding the week's events will be the film "The Letter." It features Pope Francis meeting with local leaders from India, Senegal, Hawaii, and the Brazilian Amazon. Each of them represents a voice that is not being heard - the voice of wildlife, the voice of the Indigenous, the voice of the youth, and the voice of the poor. 

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Monday through Friday: Please approach the presiding priest directly after the 12:05 Mass to request reconciliation.

Sacrament of Baptism

Persons wanting to arrange a baptism should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office at least two months before the desired date to arrange catechesis and the baptism celebration.

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

connection and make sure **StJosephChurch-Audio098** is chosen before you open the *Listen Everywhere* app. If you don't do this, your smartphone will default to another Wi-Fi address, and you will not be able to connect to the hearing system. **NOTE**: If your hearing aids are equipped with Bluetooth, the system will play directly into your hearing aids. If you don't have Bluetooth, you'll need to use earphones with your smartphone.
