

#### Today's Gospel: John 3:16-18

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

# THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: Week of June 4

**History: June 9** On this day in 1597, Saint Joseph Ancieta, S.J. died. He is called "Apostle of Brazil. It was said that birds and beasts paid him reverence: he seemed in innocence to resemble Adam before the fall. When in captivity he composed a hymn of 6,000 Latin verses in Our Lady's honor." He was Brazil's most famous missionary, and the founder of the cities of Sao Paulo and Rio de Janeiro.

Saint: James Berthieu SJ martyr (1831-96) Born in France, Berthieu was ordained as a diocesan priest for nine years before joining the Jesuits. He was then sent to work among the people of Madagascar, a French colony. He was not naturally suited for missionary work, saying, "My uselessness and my spiritual misery serve to humiliate me, but not discourage me. I await the hour when I can do something, with the grace of God." He quickly realized that he was to be caught up in the violence of the rebellion against the colonial powers. He said, "I don't want to possess any land but a little heart to love people in the divine heart of Jesus." In 1881, the French government expelled all religious from France, and forced him to leave his own missions in Madagascar. In 1894, a second rebellion broke out, this time directed not only against French colonial powers but against missionaries as well. Offered the choice to renounce Christianity and be spared execution, he said "I absolutely cannot agree to that, my son; I prefer to die." A rebel captain shot him and then had his body thrown into a crocodile infested river. This seems to have fulfilled words he frequently preached in his catechesis, "Even if you were to be devoured by a crocodile, you would arise."

Ignatian Spirituality: the role of desires (part three of three) To sum up the two previous installments: one element of the dynamic of The Spiritual Exercises is to bring into a fruitful and powerful conjunction the obscurely desired and as yet unknown finality—union with God-- and the person's desire for that union, mediated by finding God "in all things" and doing God's will in each choice. To say all that is to attend to the human side of a process of growth that is entirely the work of the Spirit. What we can do is 'to make some suggestions' and 'entirely to trust' in 'the gentle arrangement of Divine Providence' who 'requires cooperation from his creatures.'

In light of the fact that the Covid-19 transmission rate is now at its lowest level ever and risks are extremely low, Eucharistic Ministers are no longer obligated to

wear a mask during the distribution of communion.

**HEARING ASSISTANCE SYSTEM UPDATE:** A few parishioners have been reporting problems with our new hearing system. Most of the time, the following will be causing the issue: Every time



you come to OSJ, you'll need to go into your Wi-Fi connection and make sure **StJosephChurch-Audio098** is chosen before you open the *Listen Everywhere* app. If you don't do this, your smartphone will default to another Wi-Fi address, and you will not be able to connect to the hearing system. **NOTE:** If your hearing aids are equipped with Bluetooth, the system will play directly into your hearing aids. If you don't have Bluetooth, you'll need to use earphones with your smartphone.

Subject: PEACE BE UNTO YOU

Hello Eric,

How are you doing?

I need a favor from you, email me as soon as you get

this message.

God Bless,

Fr. Frank Hannafey

Please be on the lookout for similar emails AND PLEASE DO NOT RESPOND TO THEM. There is always a sense of urgency with these scam emails which is one clue. They are also always very brief and Fr. Hannafey's email address (fhannafey@oldstjoseph.org) is never the email address they use. 

#### **Hearing Enhancements**

Old St. Joseph's is equipped with an audio hearing loop. Switch on the T-coil function of your device to use the loop.

#### **Sacrament of Reconciliation**

Monday through Friday: Please approach the presiding priest directly after the 12:05 Mass to request reconciliation.

#### Sacrament of Baptism

Persons wanting to arrange a baptism should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office at least two months before the desired date to arrange catechesis and the baptism celebration.

#### **Anointing of the Sick**

The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

#### **Sacrament of Matrimony**

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

#### **Rite of Christian Initiation**

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

#### **Mass of Christian Burial**

The funeral director should call the parish office.


Due to the Memorial Day holiday, the May 28 collection was not counted in time for inclusion in this weekend's bulletin and will be published in the June 11 bulletin.
