Today's Gospel: Matthew: 9:36-10:8

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: Week of June 18

History June 19 1558: On this day, the First General Congregation of the Society of Jesus opened, nearly two years after the death of Ignatius on July 31, 1556. It was delayed because of a war between King Philip II of Spain and Pope Paul IV. Fr. Diego Laynez was elected Superior General. Nineteen Fathers attended, including five of the First ten Companions: Nicholas Bobadilla, Paschase Broet, Simon Rodriguez, and Alfonso Sameron, along with Laynez.

Saint: June 21 Aloysius Gonzaga SJ - Gonzaga was born in the middle of the 16th century, in the throes of the Reformation, into what could be called the epitome of a dysfunctional family. His royal ancestors included despots who condoned political murders, debauchery and extortion. They survived multiple assassination attempts while bleeding white their subjects through excessive taxes. Aloysius called himself "a piece of twisted iron that needed to be straightened out" and renounced his inheritance to become a Jesuit. He had a remarkable toughness of character that could stand up to quarreling princes and lead a Roman rabble to confession. When a feud broke out in 1588 among members of the Gonzaga clam, Aloysius, aged 20, was the only one deemed imperturbable, honest and clear-headed enough to settle it. He developed a reputation for innocence, not founded on ignorance or prudery, but on genuine respect for the dignity of each individual person. At 23, Aloysius, still a scholastic, died while helping victims of the plague, laying down his life for the sick, the impoverished, the marginalized.

Ignatian Spirituality: Principle and Foundation (first of three installments) The opening of the Spiritual Exercises offers an overview of the entirety of Ignatian spirituality: begin with the end in mind. The "end" or purpose of human living is salvation, everlasting life in union with God, through praise, reverence and service to God. All other things are created to help us attain that end. So, Ignatius reasons, we use those things to the extent they help us to this ultimate end and rid ourselves of them if they hinder this union. This gives rise to the necessity that we become "indifferent" to all created things. By this Ignatius doesn't mean careless unconcern, but rather an interior freedom from attachment to anything that hinders us from attaining our real goal of union with God. Ignatius offers specific examples ("we should not want health rather than sickness, riches rather than poverty, honor rather than dishonor, long rather than short life") but his point is that in all good choices, we desire and choose whatever is "most conducive for us to the end for which we are created."



COMMUNION UPDATE:

In light of the fact that the Covid-19 transmission rate is now at its lowest level ever and risks are extremely low, Eucharistic Ministers are no longer obligated to

wear a mask during the distribution of communion.

following will be causing the issue: Every time you come to OSJ, you'll need to go into your Wi-Fi connection and make sure **StJosephChurch-Audio098** is chosen before you open the *Listen Everywhere* app. If you don't do this, your smartphone will default to another Wi-Fi address, and you will not be able to connect to the hearing system. **NOTE**: If your hearing aids are equipped with Bluetooth, the system will play directly into your hearing aids. If you don't have Bluetooth, you'll need to use earphones with your smartphone.

Hello Eric,

I need a favor from you, email me as soon as you get

Please be on the lookout for similar emails AND PLEASE DO NOT RESPOND TO THEM. There is always a sense of urgency with these scam emails which is one clue. They are also always very brief and Fr. 

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Monday through Friday: Please approach the presiding priest directly after the 12:05 Mass to request reconciliation.

Sacrament of Baptism

Persons wanting to arrange a baptism should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office at least two months before the desired date to arrange catechesis and the baptism celebration.

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

Mass of Christian Burial

The funeral director should call the parish office.
