THIS WEEK IN JESUIT HISTORY: Week of June 25

Presider: Fr. Holland SJ

History - June 27, 1581: 400 copies of Campion's Decem Rationes appear on the benches of Oxford University Church. Campion, writing to the "Learned Members of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge", presents 10 reasons for the truth of the Catholic Church. He invokes scripture, the nature of Church and its Councils, the early Fathers, history and "All manner of Witness." Campion himself had been a Fellow of Oxford, had given speeches welcoming Queen Mary, and later Queen Elizabeth, to the school, and had been ordained a deacon in the Anglican Church, but became convinced that it was not a true continuation of the Christian faith. He ultimately was put to death for his refusal to acknowledge the Queen as Head of the Church.

June 29 - Venerable Andrew de Oviedo sj (1517-1577): He was accepted into the Society by St Ignatius in 1541, and initially ministered as a priest in Gandia, Spain. When the duke's wife died, the duke, Francis Borgia, decided to enter the Jesuits and eventually became the third General. Borgia eventually sent Oviedo and four companions to Ethiopia as missionaries in 1557. In preparation for establishing the Church there, Oviedo and another Jesuit were ordained bishops, the first Jesuits so ordained. Ethiopian Christians were Coptics, who refuted the Catholic assertion that Christ has two natures and were not interested in converting to Catholicism. Oviedo spent fourteen years living in extreme poverty and ministering mostly to five or six hundred Portuguese families scattered throughout Ethiopia. Both the King of Portugal and Pope Pius V, on learning of his situation, offered to transfer him to Japan or China, bishop Oviedo declined, saying that the Catholics, "without him, they have no priest."

Ignatian Spirituality: *Principle and Foundation (second of three installments)* As explained briefly last week, the First Principle and Foundation expresses both our goal (salvation, union with God) and our stance for obtaining it (choosing only those things that better help us attain that goal). It becomes a kind of touchstone for our progress in spiritual depth. It is a kind of X-ray that discloses to us the desire for God that is already present, perhaps explicitly, perhaps latently, perhaps strongly and consciously, perhaps obscurely and delicately. For one who has some fairly mature experience of life and some realistic sense of himself, it begins to disclose, too, the ambiguity of his desires, the darkness in his heart, his moral impotence, the feelings that can surge in revolt or revulsion. He is not free. He can desire to be free. God wants him to be free.

A few years back, someone culled email addresses listed on our website. Since then, numerous parishioners have received phishing emails. Here is an example of a phishing email sent to me:

Subject: PEACE BE UNTO YOU

Hello Eric,

How are you doing?

I need a favor from you, email me as soon as you get

this message.

God Bless,

Fr. Frank Hannafey

Please be on the lookout for similar emails AND PLEASE DO NOT RESPOND TO THEM. There is always a sense of urgency with these scam emails which is one clue. They are also always very brief and Fr. Hannafey's email address (fhannafey@oldstjoseph.org) is never the email address they use. wear a mask during the distribution of communion.



If you don't have Bluetooth, you'll need to use earphones with your smartphone.

Sacrament of Baptism

Persons wanting to arrange a baptism should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office at least two months before the desired date to arrange catechesis and the baptism celebration.

Anointing of the Sick

The anointing of the sick takes place during the 5:30 pm Vigil Mass on the first Saturday of each month.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Persons wanting to be married in the parish should call the front office at least nine months before the desired date.

Rite of Christian Initiation

Unbaptized adults who are considering baptism into the Catholic Church, baptized Catholics who have received no other sacraments and who want to be confirmed and to receive First Eucharist, and baptized non-Catholics who are considering full communion in the Catholic Church should call Christine Szczepanowski at the parish office.

Mass of Christian Burial

The funeral director should call the parish office.
