Today's Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

Then they came to Capernaum, and on the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes. In synagogue was a man with unclean spirit; he cried out, "What have you to do with Jesus Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One God!" Jesus rebuked him and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!" The unclean spirit convulsed him and with a loud cry came out of him. All were

amazed and asked one another, "What is this? A new teaching with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." His fame spread everywhere throughout the whole region of Galilee.

Pray for Peace with Old St. Joseph's Church



The Ignatian Spirituality & Formation and Care for Creation Committees Invite You to a Lenten Eight-Week Spiritual Exercises Series:

Bring Christ to the World

What: The series will be an eight-week guided prayer experience for small groups, modeled on the Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius of Loyola. Each group will meet weekly for about an hour. Participants can choose Sundays after the 9:30 am Mass, Sundays after the 11:30 am Mass, or Tuesdays at 10 am. Each week will have a theme. During the weeks between meetings, participants will pray and reflect on scriptural readings on their own in accord with each theme. Participants will gather each week in small groups to share reflections and experiences of the weekly prayer periods.

When and Where: The first meetings will be Sunday, February 11 and Tuesday, February 13, respectively, and will meet weekly in the OSJ Rectory. The series will run for eight consecutive weeks, with exception to Easter Sunday and Easter Tuesday. The last meetings will be held on Sunday, April 7 and Tuesday, April 9.


