#### March 10, 2024 | The Fourth Sunday in Lent (A) - Laetare Sunday

Today's Gospel: John 9:1, 6-9, 13-17, 34-38

As Jesus passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. He spat on the ground and made clay with the saliva, and smeared the clay on his eyes, and said to him, "Go wash in the Pool of Siloam" — which means Sent —. So, he went and washed, and came back able to see.

His neighbors and those who had seen him earlier as a beggar said, "Isn't this the one who used to sit and beg?" Some said, "It is, " but others said, "No, he just looks like him." He said, "I am."

They brought the one who was once blind to the Pharisees. Now Jesus had made clay and opened his eyes on a sabbath. So, then the Pharisees also asked him how he was able to see. He said to them, "He put clay on my eyes, and I washed, and now I can see." So, some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." But others said, "How can a sinful man do such signs?" And there was a division among them. So, they said to the blind man again, "What do you have to say about him, since he opened your eyes?" He said, "He is a prophet."

They answered and said to him, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Then they threw him out.

When Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, he found him and said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" He answered and said, "Who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?" Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and the one speaking with you is he." He said, "I do believe, Lord," and he worshipped him.



**The Scrutinies:** As part of their final preparations for Baptism, the Elect/Catechumens will experience the Scrutinies. These are special prayers for the Elect that they may be free of and protected from any evil and anything that is not of God. The Scrutinies are celebrated on the 3rd, 4th, & 5th Sundays of Lent, taking place after the homily. Because they are connected to Baptism, on the Sundays of the Scrutinies, the Church suggests we use the readings from Cycle A (even though we are currently in Cycle B). On these Sundays we will hear the story of the woman at the well, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus...each of these Gospel stories proclaim profound truths concerning Baptism and the new life in Christ that our Elect will experience at the Easter Vigil. During these days of Lent, please keep our Elect, as well as our candidates, in your prayers.



**Dear Fellow Parishioners:** For many years Old St. Joseph's has been entrusted with the mission of ministering to the patients at Pennsylvania Hospital. This is а great responsibility as the

Catholic patient population at the Hospital exceeds 50 patients most of the time. A very small group of ministers in our Parish are carrying out this ministry by visiting the Catholic patients and offering them the Eucharistic. At present there are only 7 active ministers of whom only 4 visit the Hospital on Sundays. This ministry is therefore in great need of additional volunteers.

All of us who serve in this ministry can tell you about the spiritually powerful encounters we regularly experience. We frequently meet patients who are enormously appreciative of our visits regardless of whether they are devout practicing Catholics or have not been connected to a church in many years. And I can't even put into words the incredible blessings we receive as ministers by sharing the Eucharist and a few minutes of prayer with folks who are in need of spiritual as well as physical care. The Gospels tell us of the many times that Jesus healed those who were suffering both physically and spiritually. We are so blessed here at Old St. Joseph's to have the opportunity to imitate the life of Jesus in this way.




