## March 31, 2024 | Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord



Dear Parishioners and Friends of Old St. Joseph's Church,

The day I began to write this message (ten days before Easter Sunday to meet a publication deadline) it was 29 degrees Fahrenheit outside with strong windchills making it feel much colder. I could not help but ask myself—is Easter almost here? Yes, Easter has indeed arrived, early this year. Our hearts, minds, bodies, and our personal and communal faith journeys long for the joy and truth that Easter brings us.

Our faith this Easter and every Easter is that the Lord has truly risen and our God continues to offer us hope and the promise of new life. Christ's Resurrection seems especially urgent and welcome for us in the times we are living. The good news we celebrate this Easter is that into the uncertainty of our present experience in the world the Risen Lord comes to dwell with us. Because of what God has done and continues to do in the Resurrection of Christ we can ourselves dwell in confidence and peace. This is very good news indeed.

The scriptures tell us that the first believers in Jesus were confused, afraid, and uncertain about the future after his suffering and death. In our vulnerability we too can recognize perhaps more clearly our need for Christ as Savior. We welcome Christ into our suffering and into our weary hearts and bodies. We also welcome the Risen One into the joy and love that also animates our lives in many graced ways. Let us try to rest with the Risen Lord for a while this Easter.

Part of my own personal Easter imagination is that at least two or three persons were needed to roll away the heavy stone from that dark empty tomb on the first Easter morning. It will also take two or three of us gathered together in a community of faith to help each other joyfully celebrate the coming of the Risen Christ into our lives and world. Let us generously help one another welcome the Risen Christ this Easter. The Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins (1844-1889) in his famous poem "The Wreck of the Deutschland" writes: "Let Him Easter in us, be a dayspring to the dimness of us." I've always loved and learned from Hopkins' use of the word "Easter" as a verb instead of a noun. Easter is always about living. Easter can deeply transform all dimensions of our lives. We pray that we are open to allow Christ to "Easter in us" in these days and always.

On behalf of the parish staff at Willings Alley, sincere thanks for your continued presence in our community and your generosity to Old St. Joseph's Church.






