Today's Gospel: John 12:19-31

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, " Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have

you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.







PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Old St. Joseph's Parish Pastoral Council: Rationale, Role of Elected Council Members, Election Schedule for This Year

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia encourages every parish to have a Parish Pastoral Council that will "foster full participation of the entire parish in the pastoral life and mission of the parish and of the Universal Church." The Old Saint Joseph's Parish Pastoral Council currently consists of eleven members, including the Pastor, one ex officio member from the Parish Finance Council, and six elected members.

The Pastoral Council advises the pastor, assists in pastoral planning, and represents the rest of the community to the Pastor. Pastoral planning may include developing a long-term pastoral plan and addressing our community's organization and programs. The Pastoral Council communicates with and cooperates with the Finance Council as needed.

The Pastoral Council meets monthly except for one month in summer and meets in extraordinary sessions as needed. In addition, members seek out parishioners' opinions, ideas and increased participation through personal outreach and attendance at parish-wide listening sessions. Members may be asked to communicate with parish ministries or committees, or with appropriate representatives of other organizations and ministries. Council members should expect to devote an average of two hours per week to Council activities. All seats to be filled or reelected will be for a term of three years, starting June 1, 2024, renewable once.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR ELECTED COUNCIL MEMBER

- Two years registered as a parish member
- Regular mass attendance
- Active participation in a parish ministry, committee, and/or community. The bulletin lists most parish ministries, communities, and committees that can serve as a reference.
- Candidate nomination comes from a fellow parishioner. Self-nominations are not permitted.

NOMINATION AND ELECTION PROCESS

- •Three seats on the Pastoral Council will be filled.
- •Nominations will open on April 7 and close on April 21.
- •To nominate, please first consult that person to make sure they are willing to stand for election.
- •Please submit the person's full name and either phone number or email address, to the Parish Pastoral Council's email address, osjpc@oldstjoseph.org.
- •Paper nomination forms, available in the back of the church beginning on April 7, can be filled out and left in the collection basket or in the parish office.
- •Nominees will be vetted for minimum qualifications and ballots prepared. Each candidate is asked to submit a photo and a brief election statement for publication in Bulletin and website.
- •Voting begins on May 5 and will close on May 19.
- •Every registered parishioner eighteen years of age or older is eligible to vote.
- •Voting is online at the parish website; a security code procedure is explained at the web site.
- •Assistance with voting by computer and cell phone will be available in Barbelin Hall on Sundays May 5 and 19.
- •Election results will be announced on the Parish website as soon as possible thereafter.
